The first race of our Spring Racing Series is just a week away and as the weather begins to warm and the daylight is giving us more outdoor opportunities, our tasks focus on cleaning a winters worth of grime and scunge off our boats and making sure they are ready to sail well. I find getting the boat cleaned up and making sure all the lines, sails,



winches, motor and steering are all ship shape is kind of a cathartic process that gives a great deal of satisfaction. The problem is that usually a thorough inspection of our craft usually adds several new items to our "to do" list. I guess that's just the reality of boat ownership, strike 5 items from the list and add 8 more!

Lots of things have been going on in the background to get us ready for racing season. Tom Hubbard designed and produced an incredible poster that we have circulated at the Marina announcing our Thursday night racing series and we have already had several folks respond who are interested in crewing. I look at each one of these folks as potential future members and contributors to our club programs. Thank you, Tom, for ALL your contributions to the club.

Shelley Conti has set up the regatta network for registration for all our racing series so get your registration in and enjoy the fun starting April 6th. Thanks, Shelley, for making all this magic work.

Ross Chamberlain has been very busy in the race mark restoration and placement project. Ross was able to source two used but very functional steel floats that are going to be key to having our race mark placement last for a long time. Ross has personally restored the floats with grinding off rust, applying an epoxy primer, and finishing with anti-fowling bottom paint. CSR Marine Services (Paul Grove) donated about \$300 worth of primer and bottom paint to the club to assist in the project. Next task is for Gordon Kells-Murphy to lead a rope splicing clinic to build the segments of $\frac{3}{4}$ " anchor rope we need to have all the components ready to splash in mid-April. A diagram of this process is in the EXTRAS section of the Barnacle.

So, racers, all we need is boats to register, show up and enjoy the water and friendly competition that our Thursday Night Racing program offers with minimal effort. First warning is at 1825 with a single start at 1830. See you on the water.

Connection with Maritime High School

On Monday, March 6, Doug Andrews and Linda Stryker met with Maritime High School faculty and a group of citizens representing many varied marine-related groups. This included the Virginia V, Elliot Bay Design,



Trident Seafood, the college Maritime Academy, the Northwest Maritime Center, a pile driving company, a rowing club rep, and others, to examine the program offered through the Highline School District Maritime High School. We got a mini tour that included their boat building wood shop, their hydroponics lab, fish tanks, and classrooms. This is a special focused school, much like Aviation High School. Studies include marine life, underwater robotics, boat design, and I believe mechanical skills will be taught as well. Math and English skills are incorporated into the curriculum and projects, including doing research on various historic maritime related events. Currently, they have a total of about 80 students, in Freshman and Sophomore years, and will be adding a Junior class next year.

Our Yacht Club is considering how we can use some Club funds to further support getting more young people connected to boating, and is entertaining ideas from others in the club as well. We left this meeting with a few ideas percolating about partnering with the High School. Perhaps a "day on the boats" with our club hosting the kids, or perhaps a scholarship to sailing lessons, or a service project done jointly? Lots of ideas.



Tacoma Mountaineers Basic Crewing/Sailing Course Registration opens Feb 6th

Learn the skills to be a welcome member of the crew on a friend's sailboat! This course will cover the knowledge needed to feel comfortable stepping aboard a sailboat and contributing to the fun of sailing the boat on the Salish Sea. We will cover: basic crewing skills, names for all the stuff onboard,

basic sail trim, points of sail, staying safe while on a sailboat, what to wear and even learn some useful knots.

This course consists of three classroom sessions and four on the water sessions, one at the dock and 3 out sailing in the Tacoma Area. The classroom sessions will be Monday, April 3rd, Monday, April 10th and Monday, April 17th. They will be held at the Tacoma Mountaineer's Program Center, from 6:30 to 8:30 pm.

The dockside session be held on Saturday April 8th at 10am at the Foss Waterway Public Dock.

Students will pick the various scheduled sails based on what are most convenient for them.

Our lessons our based on the textbook Sailing Made Easy, by the American Sailing Association. Note - This is not an ASA sponsored course, and those who complete it will **not** earn their ASA 101 certification.

Cost of the course is \$150 for Mountaineer members, \$175 for non-members. This does not include the cost of the text book.
