In the discussion, an amendment to the proposed Bylaws Change was offered by Debra Valpey:

Between the first and second sentences of Section III.3, insert a new second sentence "Associate Members are not allowed to fly TTPYC burgees on their boats, and their membership cards will reference the exclusion of reciprocal privileges."
