The second and third races of the CYCT Harbor Series are complete. While the official series results are not yet posted, TTPYC's Les Chevaux Blancs and Solitaire made a strong showing throughout the

series and will most likely find a place on the podium. Well done.

The Toliva Shoals race was held February 17. Equus, Les Chevaux Blancs, Blue Max, Seabisquit and Work Release made the trip to Olympia. The crisp clear day Friday for the delivery provided excellent views of the mountains. The race began with modest winds and drizzle in Budd Inlet. After a few hours the precipitation subsided as did the wind. The race shortened at the Toliva Shoal marker.

- Cruising class will not use handicaps and be scored on elapsed time.
- An orange flag on the race committee boat will define the boat end of the start and finish line.

The TTPYC Spring Series begins Thursday April 4. There will be a practice session on Monday April 1 at 6:30. A start line will be set at K mark. We will do a few starts followed by a race to the A or L mark. This is a great opportunity to train crew and just have fun. No registration, just show up and be on CH 72. There will also be a practice session on Monday April 29.

The Spring Regatta is Saturday April 20. This will be a full day of racing. Wind permitting, we will try to have 4 or 5 races. Details are on the racing page and race book. Thanks to Frolic for stepping forward as Race Committee.

The relaunching process for "C" mark is underway. Dwight Motz has designed the anchoring/ground tackle system like that used for "A" mark last year. The aim is to have it in the water before racing begins.

Each one of us can help by encouraging our dock mates to come out and race their boats. Tom Hubbard has placed posters around the marina to promote our racing. We have 18 events this season and will need everyone's help to support the schedule by volunteering for at least one race committee date. - Go to Arabella's Landing Marina website <u>www.arabellaslanding.com</u>
- Select the Book Reservation button under "overnight moorage information" then enter the club's event code (ttpycapr2024) and select dates April 12-14th to view available slips.
- Follow the steps to make a slip reservation and provide payment for the moorage. You will be able to view slips held, but not yet reserved by another club member.
- These slips will be held for the club until 5 days before the scheduled arrival date on Friday, April 12, 2024, after which they become available to the general public. Club participants may continue to reserve slips without using the event code, if slips are still available.
- When you make your reservations, you will receive a confirmation email noting:
- Payment: 100% of moorage cost is due at time of booking Cancellations: Must cancel by the date in the slip confirmation email to receive a refund for the entirety of the reservation period, less \$10.00 processing fee

Commodore Steve's Blog Post

It's Sunday, February 25, 2024, and as I sit here at my desk with the wind beginning to blow, (the prediction is for gusts in the 30's), I can't help but remember an event that happened while in the Sea of Cortez a couple of years ago. Covid was waning and we were once again free to return to Loreto and wake up Ørn, (our Tartan 37) which had been moored on a double tether in the protected harbor of Puerto Escondido for a period of almost a year.

Before starting this adventure, leaving Puget Sound, making the great left turn down the Pacific Coast, I equipped Ørn with an HF radio and obtained my ham

General license (KI7WKW). It was one of the smartest moves that I have ever made.



There are several amateur ham radio nets that provide boat following and weather briefing services to vessels operating in Mexican waters. Among those is the Chubasco net. A group of experienced and mostly retired boaters, these folks are on the radio early every morning.

Waking up our boat turned out to be a more

daunting task than we anticipated. And it took the greater part of my son's twoweek vacation to deal with various problems that cropped up. Finally, we departed for Isla Carmen and Punta Colorado, where we anchored for the night.

The following morning, I tuned up my radio and connected with the Chubasco net. After I checked in, and told them where we were, a conversation began. A retired boater named Dave, speaking from Arizona, told me that we were in a very beautiful place and that he had visited there many times. He even pointed out a nice beach for picnicking and told us about a sea cave nearby. Then he said, "you better check your anchor and get a good book, because the wind is going to blow upwards of 40 knots and you're going to be stuck there for about four days". Another operator broke in and added, according to Buoy Weather .com it was beginning to blow just north of us.



Yikes! It was Saturday, and we had flight reservations for Monday. I started the motor, pulled the anchor, unfurled the genoa and headed downwind to Puerto Escondido. An hour later, as we crossed the channel towards the protected bay of Puerto Escondido, the wind was blowing in the high twenties.
