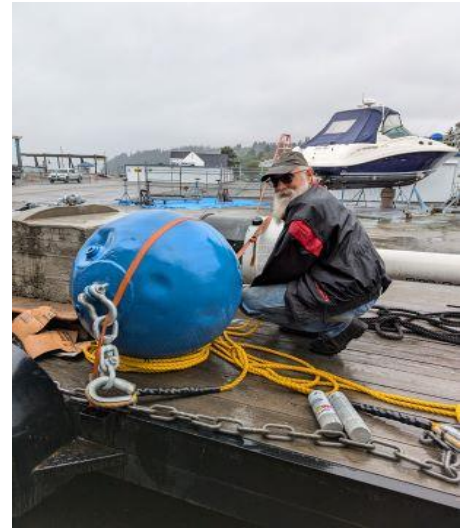
mixed and poured the concrete into the anchor form, and transported it to the marina. Gordon spliced the anchor rode, Brian and Michael assembled the anchor,

From the Blog... Klawock



We realized that the taxi was not running Saturday, so we had no way to get to Klawock for the pole raising unless we hitchhiked. I am too old for that. So we untied and ran up the channel to a little bay by Klawock and took the RIB to town. They were carrying the pole from the carving shed, about a mile away from the raising site. Dean jumped in and helped carry it. When we got to the raising site, I also helped raise the pole. This pole was for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women. These two poles are for the community, so are the only poles that do not face the water, but rather the town. After the raising, we ask the mayor if we could bring the boat into the harbor, as it is quite small. He said no problem, so we went back to the boat and

anchored it at the head of the bay. Then we went to the gym for the ceremony, dinner and more dancing. The dinner was traditional food - salmon, halibut, herring roe on seaweed, salmon head, fish egg salad, dried salmon, smoked salmon, rice, potatoes, and macaroni salad. We left the dancing around 9 pm and went back to the boat. I happened to be awake at 1:15 when I heard the drums beat the closing beats.
