#### NEW MEMBER PROFILE: Brian and Janice Newman

Brian and Janis have joined the Three Tree Yacht Club while not currently owning a boat. Brian owned a 22-foot open Boston Whaler type boat in the Florida Keys, back in the 80's. He never officially named the boat but admits to calling it his "reef beater" because he enjoyed exploring the mangrove swamps in it.

He describes a powerful boating experience harkening back to his time in the Navy on a destroyer. The ship was steaming through two converging typhoons in the Western Pacific on a 560" destroyer. They spent several days trying to sail out of the colliding storms while punching through 60" swells, burying the bow of the ship along with it 15" tall forward gun mount, over, and over, and over again! For five days the seamen were not allowed to open any hatches, and were ordered light general quarters, which meant closed compartments throughout the vessel.

Other than that, it is always a special time when he is out on the water where there is nothing but the sound of wind and the water lapping against the hull of the boat. It's a bonus to see marine life, and it is especially extra special to be sailing at sunset.

His sailing conversion is rather recent. He just started sailing in October of 2022, and has enthusiastically taken sailing class 101, 103, and is currently taking navigation 105. He will soon start 104 and 114 about open water catamaran sailing. He jumped at the opportunity to be on the PSSI committee boat during a race and began to feel the pull of the racing world.

He spent 6 years in the Navy, serving in San Diego, Lake Michigan, Norfolk, RA and  $1\frac{1}{2}$  year at Roosevelt Rhodes in Puerto Rico, followed by three years on the destroyer. Then he put in 16 years as a DOD contractor with electrical engineering experience, and managed to live near the Adriatic, Mediterranean, England and Italy - all while drawn to water. In total, he has lived in or visited 36 countries. He feels it is unfortunate that after having a boat so long ago in Florida, he never bumped into anyone in the sailing crowd. The 16 years that followed were spent in Montana (where he grew up), where he transitioned to a startup software development company. Although he enjoyed a long list of outdoor activities available in the Rocky Mountains, he and his wife, Janis (a UW Alumni) decided to retire and move to the Seattle area where he is thoroughly enjoying going all in with sailing. Janis has a background in Pharmacy. Currently they live out in Maple Valley and are enjoying serious gardening.

They chose to join the TTPYC after Brian signed up for the PSSI racing class with Ross Chamberlain, which included 4 races with TTPYC. After studying all the course material, , then reading the TTPYC website from end to end, he felt the club culture along with the racing, cruising, and social events were a good fit. He is looking forward to being an active club participant this summer and beyond.
